CARL BRENDERS NEW ART BOOK

Pride of Place is the title for this just published book featuring over 150 images in 192 pages of pure wildlife art by Belgian painter Carl Brenders. *"It has been said that art begins where nature ends. In the case of the work of Carl Brenders, art and nature blend in a seamless continuum."* These are the words of Robert Bateman describing the work of Carl in the foreword to Pride of Place.

Illustrated in color throughout, this book is a must for any lover of wildlife art. Carl describes the inspiration for many of the paintings, and his philosophy on wildlife art. It also gives a rare insight into Carl's work by showing some of his preliminary sketches.

In the last year, artist Morgan Weistling has been the winner of a number of prestigious awards, including the Patron's Choice and Artists' Choice Awards at the Autry Museum's Masters of the American West Fine Art Exhibition and Sale. This newest limited



edition release tenderly depicts the bond between two sisters. Sisters is a warm portrait of the beauty of the sibling relationship, a relationship that will only grow stronger in the face of adversity and with the passage of time.

The artist states, "The love between these sisters, who are very close in real life, is testimony to the love and caring possible in our families. Many people are fortunate to have their siblings as their best friends."



Count Zinzendorf and the Indians 1742 Edited by William Reichel.



n December of 1741, Count Zinzendorf came to Philadelphia to begin one of the most remarkable journeys any man ever traveled through the wilderness of America searching for the original peoples, the Indians of the Eastern Frontier.

As the newly recognized head of the Moravian Movement among the Indians of the New World, this amazing man wasted little time venturing into the Wilderness. With God as his leader, Zinzendorf labored far into the Frontier traveling extensively to meet with tribal leaders as no man before him had done, and it was through the eyes of this man of the cloth and his amazing grace, that would allow him to record the narratives that speak to us today, giving us glimpses in that moment in time of what life was really like on the frontier of 1742.

Count Zinzendorf's acquaintances were many. Conrad Weiser, Henry Antes, Martin Mack, Allumapees or Sasoonan to name but a few. Yet the key to this book is the pages of footnotes by Editor Reichel that fills in the blanks with vital knowledge about the critical French & Indian War years. But the most curious part of the book is "An Account of the United Brethren at Bethlehem with the



Defenders of the Frontier: Colonel Henry Bouquet and the Officers and Men of the Royal American Regiment, 1763-1764 by Kenneth Stuart, Ph.D.

 \mathbf{S} wiss-born Colonel Henry Bouquet remains one of the most unappreciated British Army officers from the pre-Revolutionary War period in North America. During the uneasy peace that followed the French



and Indian War, Bouquet and his Royal Americans, along with troops from the Black Watch and Highland regiments, protected and rescued settlers on the western frontiers of Pennsylvania and Maryland from increasingly frequent Indian attacks. Bouquet's victory at Bushy Run and his triumphant march into the Ohio Country essentially halted the Indian uprising of 1763-1764. With patience, military discipline and tactical skill, he defeated a resourceful and deadly enemy. Historian Martin Blumenson called Bouquet the foremost soldier of his day. Ironically, other British Army defeats and disasters of a more sensational nature often

obscure Bouquet's brilliant accomplishments. Military historian and instructor Kenneth P. Stuart thoroughly researched the official papers of Bouquet and his contemporaries for this detailed study. Correspondence reveals Bouquet's highly trained military mind, his personal frustrations with the colonial assemblies and the British high command, and his private moments of occasional depression. This well-rounded work includes maps, illustrations, annotations, appendices, a select bibliography and an index. 2007, $5\frac{1}{2} \times 8\frac{1}{2}$, paper, index, 244 pp., \$25.00.

Favorite Nursery Rhymes from Mother Goose Illustrated by Scott Gustafson.

From nonsense to lessons learned, the forty five rhymes in this book include the very well known (Itsy Bitsy Spider) and the somewhat familiar, (Hickety, Pickety, my black hen). The truly fantastic pictures



speak more than one thousands words in details as artist Scott Gustafson riffs in paint on themes present and imagined in each verse.

Nursery rhymes are classic and so are some of artist's interpretations but other paintings are surprises, like an anthropomorphic baking bear, a pelican sea captain and Peter Piper as a pug on two legs. Jack (Be Nimble) is a leaping cricket and Yankee Doodle a fun-loving chipmunk on a full-sized horse.

Scott Gustafson's unique style, influenced by legendary book illustrators Arthur Rackham and N.C. Wyeth, makes this a volume to be treasured by children and illustrated book lovers of all ages.



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Wayne Hyde's monument bronze sculpture "The Homecoming", a statue honoring the founders of Chambersburg, PA (just west of Gettysburg) was recently unveiled in front of a crowd gathered at Fort Chambers Park in Chambersburg. This

has been a "years in the making" piece originating from Wayne's appearance with Lord Nelson's Gallery during History Meets the Arts.

"The Homecoming" depicts the year 1781 when Chambersburg founder Benjamin Chambers welcomed home his son, James, a colonel, and his grandson, Benjamin, from their service in the Revolutionary War. "*This statue is an important and everlasting*

reminder of the sacrifices, which led to the founding of Chambersburg," the Mayor of Chambersburg said. "This statue will serve as a reminder of the sacrifices so valiantly made, and will be a tribute and reflection to veterans of all wars." Wayne added, "I wanted it to reflect the dedication and honor (veterans) deserve. I hope this piece will help celebrate those in the future and the past that helped support this great nation."

INTRODUCING MELVIN JOHANSEN'S BRONZE TO LORD NELSON'S GALLERY

New at Lord Nelson's Gallery, but not new to the art world, sculptor Melvin Johansen, born in 1915, has devoted his life to the celebration of wildlife through reverent and joyous representation. He began his career as a taxidermist with the Snow Museum of Natural History in Oakland, California. Through his work at the museum, Johansen traveled throughout North America photographing and documenting various species in their natural environments. His work allowed him to study animal anatomy and form with an academic comprehensiveness.

In 1972, Johansen retired as senior curator of the Oakland Museum in order



to focus on his artwork. Johansen's figures feature a loose, appropriately unrefined texture that prevents them from appearing overly technical and suggests movement and presence even when his subject is depicted at rest. His appreciation and insight of form leads to compositions of validity and grace. Now in his nineties, Johansen lives at his home

and studio with his wife Darleen in Northern California.
