

Risking everything, desperate soldiers often attempted to escape harsh discipline or unbearable circumstances by deserting. To help capture these run-aways, the use of allied Indians began in earnest after 1760. One of the most successful captures involved the return of 14 men taken by the Seneca in 1762. Some of these deserters were of the 60th Royal American Regiment -- as seen in this painting -- who were returned to their commandant at Fort Niagara.



<u>Carolina in Crisis:</u> <u>Cherokees, Colonists,</u> <u>and Slaves in the</u> <u>American Southeast,</u> <u>1756-1763</u> by Daniel J. Tortora.


In this engaging history, the author explores how the Anglo-Cherokee War reshaped the political

and cultural landscape of the colonial South. Tortora chronicles the series of clashes that erupted from 1758 to 1761 between Cherokees, settlers, and British troops. The conflict, no insignificant sideshow to the French and Indian War, eventually led to the regeneration of a British-Cherokee alliance. Tortora reveals how the war destabilized the South Carolina colony and threatened the white coastal elite, arguing that the political and military success of the Cherokees led colonists to a greater fear of slave resistance and revolt and ultimately nurtured South Carolinians' rising interest in the movement for independence.

Drawing on newspaper accounts, military and diplomatic correspondence, and the speeches of Cherokee people, among other sources, this work reexamines the experiences of Cherokees, whites, and African Americans in the mid-eighteenth century. Centering his analysis on Native American history, Tortora reconsiders the rise of revolutionary sentiments in the South while also detailing the Anglo-Cherokee War from the Cherokee perspective.

<u>A Narrative of the Life of Mrs. Mary</u> <u>Jemison</u> by James Seaver.



This is one of the best Indian captivity narratives ever written. In April 1758, the Jemison settlement, about eight miles west of Gettysburg, PA, was attacked by a raiding party of French and Shawnee Indians. 15 year old Mary and one young boy were

taken captive, the rest suffered cruel deaths. Mary was soon turned over to two Seneca sisters who eventually led her to her western New York State homeland along the Genesee River. She remained voluntarily with the Seneca until her death at age 91, after rising to a position of great prominence among the tribe. In 1823, at age 80, Mary related her memoirs to James E. Seaver, who published them the following year. This is the true, first person story of Mary's life. Her story has been recounted many times over the years, and has been depicted in two scenes from artist Robert Griffing, "The Taking of Mary Jemison" and "The Adoption of Mary Jemison", both of which are available for viewing and purchase in the gallery or on our website.

<u>Indians in</u> <u>Pennsylvania</u> by Paul Wallace.

Archaeological investigations and the historical record portray the native Americans in Pennsylvania from early times. Various groups are

discussed, (although primarily the Delaware) along with villages, houses, occupations, travel, warfare, government, religion, amusements, the Iroquois Confederacy, the Beaver Wars, the Land Cessions and migrations, the Indian policy and wars, the Cornplanter Grant and more. The author also discusses Pennsylvania's Indian policies and adds to his work short biographies of famous Indians of Pennsylvania.

<u>Indians Paths of</u> <u>Pennsylvania</u> by Paul Wallace.

This book describes trails used by Native Americans as they traveled through and within what are now the borders of this state. A typical example is that of the French Creek Path, from Conestoga Indian Town to Phoenixville. The author offers a history and written description of the path, followed by instructions to the motorist who wishes to follow it. These are supplemented by superimposing a trace of the path onto a modern map of the area. Wallace uses this format to describe 131 Indian paths, adding five appendices, biographical notes and two induces.

<u>George Washington, Frontiersman</u> by Zane Grey.

Every once in a while, we may have a specific item on sale in the gallery. For now, it's George Washington, Frontiersman! This novel relates the life of the young Washington from his birth to his taking command of the Continental Army in 1775. From Washington's rumored romance with Sally Fairfax



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and his surveying trips with her husband into the Shenandoah and the Ohio River Valley to his role in General Braddock's disastrous campaign to wrest Fort Duquesne from the French, Grey captures the spirit of Washington during his young years as both a woodsman and a frontiersman, a person who liked peace but savored battle.

Grey's numerous works today sell some half a million copies a year, have been translated into twenty-three different languages, and have been made into more than a hundred motion pictures. Though most of his work is laid in the Old West, Grey's first three novels were about the early days of his native Ohio, and he returned to that setting for this work, the next to last novel he wrote.


